WHAT TIME IS IT?

I bet all of you are thinking Hump Day! Picturing a camel walking around an office asking that very question. Every class I am instructing I walk in on Wednesday and utter that phrase and everyone begins to laugh and it lightens the moment because everyone understands the reference. It has become a national phenomenon. The last time I can remember anything remotely similar was when Clara Peller, during Wendy's commercials, would utter: "Where's the beef?"

Maybe we can coin our own catch phrase... something like, "What time is it? It is Safety Time!" Whether we are getting ready to ride our magnificent machines or drive a cage. It could apply anywhere...crossing the street, painting the house or getting in a bathtub. A catchphrase to remind us to be safe!

Imagine the possibilities...saying it to your departing to anywhere husband, wife, kids, friends, co-workers, etc. and everyone knowing exactly what you mean. Now we need to come up with a visual image to tie it all together—we'll have to get back to you on that.

So..."What Time Is It?" Hopefully you remembered "Safety Time" and we can also add in it is that "time of the year"...you know when summer turns to fall even-

tually giving way, begrudgingly, to winter. It means we have a few more things to add to our safety checklist before we head out to ride.

Sun Glare – as the daylight hours grow shorter we tend to travel during time when the sunlight and resulting glare blind us. Happens in the morning and evening, varying in time and intensity, as the earth continues on its never ending journey around the sun. Here we are already difficult to see and now the folks "Sharing the Road" with us are blinded even more. Let us not forget it affects us too! What can we do? Tap your brakes, thus activating your brake lights, to let the folks behind you see you are in front of them. Utilize the left and right track of the lane you are in... movement draws attention. Do not forget the high visibility safety gear (ATGATT). Headlight modulators are a plus here also.

Daylight Savings Time ends 2 AM November 3rd. This will throw everyone a little out of sync and once again change the sunlight and glare we ride/drive in. Also remember that critters, while they can be active anytime, are particularly active at dawn and dusk.

Temperatures – You can start the day with cold temps and by afternoon it

can be down right warm. Dress in layers (unless you are lucky enough to own heated gear) so that as the temperature climbs you can remove layers to adjust your comfort level. Remember it is easier to cool down from being a little warm than it is to warm up after becoming chilled.

Tire Pressures – you will need to pay attention to your air pressures as they will be lower in colder temperatures than warm. Don't forget the T-CLOCS!

Leaves – The leaves are beautiful at this time of year when they change color, hanging onto their trees for a few last days before detaching and falling to the ground. Once on the ground they can become a hazard. If you encounter them on the road they can be extremely slippery; especially early morning when covered with the heavy dew that is prevalent at this time of year.

Loose gravel and rocks – many of the highways and by-ways we travel on have many dirt roads or drive-ways that connect to them. Over time loose rocks and gravel work their way onto the asphalt surface and with changing light conditions and sometimes our distractions trying to view the scenery can seem to come out of no where. Obviously the best solution is to identify the risk before you encounter it, but if you

this one your riding now is just heavier and does not have the aggressive tires.

ry minute of every day!
